



# About the Playwright

Terence O'Connell is well known as a director of physical and music theatre, circus, comedy, cabaret and drama. His work has been produced throughout Australia, with a number of his productions touring nationally. O'Connell was part of the Creative Team for Ceremonies at the Melbourne 2006 Commonwealth Games. O'Connell currently works for Antipodes Theatre Company in Melbourne as a writer and director, continuing both new work & adaptations.

## Synopsis

If history is told by the victors, the story of war is usually told by the blokes. Now it's the 'sheilas' turn. Nearly a thousand Australian women had a part in the Vietnam War as entertainers, typists, consular staff and army nurses. The one thing they have in common is that their lives were changed forever by Vietnam. For many of them it was the most vital and alive they had ever felt. Minefields and Miniskirts records the voices of those who were actually there; ordinary woman revealing how they survived a war and discovered what they believed in. Adapted from Siobhan McHugh's book, this play reveals through a collage of true stories, the extraordinary experiences of ordinary women in surviving a war.

## Keerthana Muthurangan as Margaret



Keerthana is the self confessed 'rookie' of the cast. Until now, Keerthana has enjoyed the theatre only as audience. She has set her foot bravely onto the stage and is enjoying every bit of it. She feels humbled and excited to be a part of the amazing crew. She feels very privileged to be able to tell the incredible stories of a few of the several amazing women, who have played significant role in Vietnam war. She plays Margaret, a housewife in Australia, married to a Vet. She reflects the emotions of hundreds of housewives of Vets around the world, the Vets who bring back unthinkable trauma post war. Keerthana feels honoured to play Margaret, who brings hope, voice and rights to the brave soldiers of Vietnam

## Tahlia Robinson-Solczaniuk as Sandy

Tahlia lives and breathes for the stage, and treats the performance spaces of Albany like Pokemon cards (she's gotta catch 'em all!) You may have seen her singing at your favourite bar, or caught her at the Town Hall as the blue haired 'Penelope' in Southern Edge Arts' own *'The Ballad of Penelope & Marlin'*. Many remember her zany antics as 'The Cat in the Hat' in ALOTCo's *'Seussical: The Musical'* but what you won't remember her from is her first lead role in Spectrum's *'Secret Bridesmaids Business'* which was sadly cancelled in the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, being forced into closure 2 days before opening night. Eager to mark Spectrum off her Theatrical Pokedex, she is delighted to have been cast as Sandy the entertainer, and feels honoured to tell the stories of some of the brave women affected by the Vietnam war.



## Priya Moodie as Kathy



Meet Priya, since a young age Priya has been involved in performing productions at her local community. Despite running a business and a hectic family life, Priya looks for opportunities to express herself through the arts. Women often don't have their stories told. This feminine portrayal of Vietnam war is powerfully compelling. Priya is inspired by the depth of her character and has worked hard to tell this story. The voices of these women need to be heard and loved to remember them.

## Trudi Anderson as Ruth



Trudi is no stranger to the stage, be it at Spectrum or ALOTCo.

Despite being seen in many comedic roles, the fantastic opportunity to give public voice to some of the thousands of Australian women who were involved with the Vietnam war, plus several musical numbers in the script, made *'Minefields and Miniskirts'* incredibly appealing to her! Trudi hopes that people leave the show with a greater appreciation for just how intense, confronting, and life changing an experience in Vietnam truly was for those involved. It has long been a poorly acknowledged part of our nations' history, the stories of the women even more so.

## Ruby Mitchell as Eve

Ruby has appeared in local musical theatre productions and recently starred in Spectrum Theatre's *'Custard'*. The role of Eve in *'Minefields and Miniskirts'* is Ruby's first lead role. Ruby has enjoyed the challenge of her most serious role, portraying the loss of faith many women experienced during war times. ## Sarah Hutton - Ensemble



Sarah has had a love of performing since an early age but only got back into theatre in 2015. Since then she has been in a number of plays and musicals including ALOTCo's *'Urinetown'* and *'Musical of Musicals'*. In her spare time she works as a psychiatrist and is a mum to two energetic boys. She has loved being a part of *'Minefields and Miniskirts'* and is so glad Michelle and Jen found a special part for her.
